Each athlete may start 3 horses (7 years or over) in classes 1 - 9 and in addition one horse (7 or 8 years old) in classes 10 to 12 (Youngster Tour).

A. Foreign and German Athletes

The best 15 athletes of the Rolex Rankings No. 113 (max. 5 per foreign nation).

B. Foreign Athletes (up to a total number of approx. 25 foreign athletes):

- 1. The FEI has the right to nominate two athletes
- 2. Up to a total number of 25 (incl. athletes acc. to A and B.1)
 - 50 % of athletes must be selected from the top 600 of the Rolex Rankings No. 113.
 - 50 % are free (ranked or unranked athletes).
- 3. 20 % of all foreign athletes may receive a wildcard; however, these athletes must be selected from the top 600 of the Rolex Rankings No. 113.

C. Further German Athletes (up to a total number of approx. 25 German athletes):

The share of foreign athletes must be at least 40 %.

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting athletes ("masterlist"), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

 - Athletes must have an "Amateur Owner's" license of their respective NF, such a licence will only be granted by NFs to those Athletes who have formally signed a statement that he/she does not earn money for riding other people's horses, giving riding lessons, or for publicity or commercial purposes, etc.
 - An Amateur Owner licence will only be granted by NFs to those Athletes who have formally signed a statement that he/she does not earn money for riding other people's horses, giving riding lessons, or for publicity or commercial purposes, etc.
 - The buying and selling of horses, as well as receiving prize money in cash, are not forbidden providing they do not constitute the competitor's mainly source of income.
 - Athletes, taking part in the CSI Amateurs competitions, may not start in the CSI competitions 1-12 (CSI3*) of this event.
 - Holding the "Amateur Owner" status, athletes are not barred from other competitions or Championships. As long as the athlete holds the "Amateur Owner" status, he/she will not be allowed to take part in international or national initial competitions with a height of 1.50 m or greater.

- 1. Invited nations: AUT, FRA, ITA, SUI with up to 3 athletes (16 to 25 years old) per nation. The athletes invited though their NF are authorized to start in agreement with the OC.

The following drivers with horses of 5 years and over may compete:

- 1. foreign drivers whose NF has received an invitation. Invitations to NF's will include the number of drivers invited to compete.
- 2. Members of the German Championship, B cadre Four-in Hand 2010 as well as 6 drivers who in agreement with the OC will be nominated by the federal trainer driving.
- 3. German drivers who have been placed at least twice 1st to 5th in a combined competition class S (including marathon) in 2009/2010.
- 4. Per four-in-hand 10 horses may be entered and 5 horses may be brought to the event.
- 5. Allowed are only four-in-hands which are going to start in classes No. 29 33.
- 6. Each driver can start only one four-in-hand in the single competitions.

CAIP/4-B (Comp. 34 - 40)

The following drivers with ponies of 5 years and over may compete:

- 1. foreign drivers whose NF has received an invitation. Invitations to NF's will include the number of drivers invited to compete.
- 2. Members of the German Championship or B cadre cadre Four-in Hand Ponies 2010 as well as 4 drivers who in agreement with the OC will be nominated by the federal trainer driving.
- 3. German drivers who have been placed at least twice 1st to 5th in a combined competition class S (including marathon) in 2009/2010.
- 4. Per four-in-hand 10 ponies may be entered and 5 ponies may be brought to the event.
- 5. Allowed are only four-in-hands which are going to start in classes No. 34 40.
- 6. Each driver can start only one four-in-hand ponies in the single competitions.

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting athletes ("masterlist"), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.



VI. FACILITIES OFFERED

A) ATHLETES

Hotel reservation for athletes have to be handed in writing with the entries. Hotel reservation which will be handed in after closing date of entries or which are not made in writing will not be handled. Hotel reservation and meals will be at the athletes own expense.

Priority will be given to the Carlton hotel Donauschingen. For the booking the OC needs the credit card details; Athletes are asked to indicate the credit card details with the written reservation. If hotel rooms are not cancelled by 31st August 2010 (closing date of definite entries) the expenses will be charged to the athlete's account, unless the room can be given to another person. The OC takes over the costs for breakfast and one meal per day for athletes of the CDI4*, CSI3*, CSI Amateurs, CAI 4A und CAI 4B from 16th to 19th September 2010.

B) GROOMS

Accommodation of grooms of horses being started in the international competitions will be at the athletes' cost. Hotel reservation has to be done by the athletes themselves. Meals for grooms of horses being started in the CDI4*, CSI3*, CSI Amateurs (one groom per athlete), CAI 4A und CAI 4B (two grooms per athlete) competitions will be at the OC's expense from 16th to 19th September 2010.

OC provides sufficient sanitary and showering facilities, with hot and cold water for male and female grooms.

For current supply (caravan or lorry) a fee of \in 50,00 has to be paid together with the entries.

C) HORSES/PONIES

All horses will be stabled on show grounds. The boxes will be available from 15^{th} to 19^{th} September, 2010. Own stable tents (except for CAIP B ponies – see below) or stabling on trailers are not permitted. Stabling of the horses being started in the international competitions is free of charge (incl. 1^{st} bedding – 3 bales of straw). For driving horses/ponies \in 120,- has to be paid when handing in the entries and may not be reimbursed. A fee of \in 30 per box (incl. VAT) will be levied for waste disposal.

For ponies which are stabled in own stable tents next to the lorry/trailer, each driver has to pay a deposit to the amount of \in 250, of which \in 100 will be reimbursed, provided the place which has been used has properly been cleaned. The deposit will not be reimbursed unless the stable manager is informed by the driver and decides that the OC has to reimburse the deposit.

For horses which cannot be brought to the event and the organizer has not been informed accordingly, the athlete or the respective NF will receive an invoice for the due stabling fees. Unless boxes have been reserved by 31st August 2010, the OC will reserve and invoice one box per horse entered. Forage and further bedding can be bought on site at customary prices. Athletes are asked to use only the assigned stables.

Attention: Driving Horses/Ponies

The OC expressively draws the attention to the fact, that authorization to participate can only be granted for the CAI Donaueschingen, if drivers stable their horses in the stable tents made available by the OC, within the restricted and supervised area.



Against the backdrop of doping discussions becoming increasingly serious and to ensure credence to equestrian sports the OC asks the drivers to accept and to support this measurement, also to ensure a positive image.

For customs and veterinary formalities for horses from abroad, the OC charges € 35,00 per horse (CSI/CDI/CAI).

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Every athlete is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification o the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Reglements 90/426 of the actual valid form (sample is enclosed to schedule) will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid from will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

<u>VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS</u>

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 23rd edition, effective January 2009, updated 1st January 2010:

Art. 137.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 139.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 139.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 137.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VI

(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

From 1 January 2005 onwards, influenza vaccination for all horses competing in FEI competitions requires a vaccination within six months + 21 days of the competition.

- 1. All horses intending to participate in FEI competition must have at least received an initial primary course of two vaccinations, given between 21 and 92 days apart. Thereafter, a third dose (referred to as the first booster) must be given within 7 months after the date of administration of the second primary dose, with at least annual boosters given subsequently (i.e. within one year of the last dose).
- 2. If the horse is scheduled to take part in an FEI competition, the last booster must have been given within 6 months + 21 days of arrival at the FEI event. (The 21-day window has been provided to enable vaccination requirements to fit in with the competition schedule).
- 3. No vaccination shall be given within 7 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.



4. All horses that were certified as correctly vaccinated under the previous FEI equine influenza vaccination rule prior to 1st January 2005, do not need to start a primary course again provided that they have complied with the previous rule of primary course and annual re-vaccinations and the new rule of a booster vaccination within 6 months + 21 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016.4)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3*/4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate. At CCI3* and CCI4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Cup Finals, Championships and Games it is recommended that a minimum of 5% of all horses (with a minimum of 3 horses tested) must be sampled (see also VR Art. 1016.5.).

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge Athletes the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

X. MISCELLANEOUS

1. PROTESTS

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

2. PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY

- The owner of the winning horse is invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix (comp. 8).
- The prize-giving ceremony of the teams placed 1st to 5th in comp. 29 (Dressage Four-in-Hand horses) will take place during the procession through the city of Donaueschingen, on 16th September 2010. All these teams placed 1st to 5th are obliged to attend the procession.

3. Distribution of Prizes and Indemnities

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 127/128 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts.

Settlement will be done per athlete. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each athlete binds himself to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the athlete.



Acc. to § 50a EstG this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the VAT from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money, as a rule the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 15 % exceeding 250 EUR (in force as of 01.01.2009); plus solidarity fee (at present 5.5 %) of the income amount. Travelling expenses being taken over or reimbursed are only regarded as revenues if they exceed the actual costs and the reimbursement for additional meal allowances acc. to § 4 Abs. 5 Satz 1 Nr. 5 EstG. The tax deduction has to be certified on demand. Those foreign athletes being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every athlete himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

4. INSURANCES

All owners and athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

5. LIABILITY

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. The OC is liable in case of intent, gross negligence as well as in case of injury to life, body or health and in further cases he is liable for compelling legal liability acc. to the legal requirements. Furthermore he also declines any liability for theft, damages, fire or other incidents.

6. EVENT'S ORGANISATION

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER (, the Chefs d'Equipe) and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all athletes and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Jumping, Dressage or Driving Department by the Foreign Judge.

7. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS

Entry right to showgrounds will be handed out to athletes, one partner per athlete, one groom per athlete, two grooms per driver and per horse two owners (max. 2 horses per athlete acc. to FEI-passport). Entry Right to stable area acc. to VR Art. 1005.2.5.

8. Closing Time of Declaration

Closing time of declaration for the all competition each day is 6:00 p.m. the previous day.

9. STARTING ORDER

The starting order will be drawn according Art. 252 (Jumping), Art. 425 (Dressage) and Art 923 (Driving).

10. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Athletes wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These athletes will start first in these competitions.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
