V. INVITATIONS

A team consist of at least one single, one pair and one four-in-hand and each nation is entitled to send up to a maximum of six Athletes consisting of up to two singles, two pairs and two four- in-hands.

Individual Athletes from nations, which cannot send a team:✓

NFs which cannot send a team may send up to 2 individual athletes in each class.

German Athletes:

The number of German athletes depends on the total number of foreign athletes entered; admitted are at least: one team (consisting of up to two individuals, two pairs and two four-in-hands), two individual athletes per class acc. to Art. 905.7.5.

All Athletes:

Number of ponies per team:

Individuals: 1 pony*)

Pairs: 3 ponies

Four-in-Hands: 5 ponies

*) A spare pony may be entered for the single class. The Athlete who uses the spare pony will be eligible for the individual classification as well as for the team classification. The spare pony can only be substituted once not later than one hour before the start of Competition A (Dressage) and must be notified in writing to the Organiser.

Age of ponies:

Ponies of 6 years or over.

Grooms

Singles and Pairs: each one groom per athlete

Four-in-Hands: each two grooms per athlete.

B) PONIES

Ponies will be stabled from 11 – 17 August 2009, the stabling fee (incl. 1st bedding) is included in the entry fee (see VII). The OC grants no reimbursement of transport charges.

C) WELCOME

The time and date of arrival of Athletes and horses and their means of transport must be given to the OC in order to facilitate them upon arrival.

D) LOCAL TRANSPORTATION ARRANGEMENTS FROM HOTEL TO SHOW GROUNDS

E) ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY ON ATHLETES AND PONIES

Advertising in Competition A and C: The competitors are authorised by the OC to display the logo of their personal sponsor on the carriage in accordance with the General Regulations Art. 135 and Art. 913.2.

Advertising in Competition B: The competitors are authorised by the OC to display the logo of their personal sponsor on the marathon carriage and on the back(s) of the groom(s) in accordance with the GR Art. 135 and Art. 913.3.

Chief Steward will check that the advertising and publicity on Athletes and horses complies with Article 913.2 and 913.3.

VII. ENTRIES

All Athletes & horses participating in any International competition must be registered with the FEI.

Athletes will be entered through their home NF.

Substitution of athletes and/or ponies

Entries have to be made through the HippoBase online entry system. Discipline responsables of National Federations who do not yet have a user account are requested to send their full name, email and phone to support@hippobase.com.

NFs are asked to enter the athletes/ponies with the correct qualifications and information on athletes/ponies (see above) into the HippoBase online system.

For withdrawals after the date of definite entries or no-shows the Athlete or the respective NF will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss incurred by the OC (i.e. stabling and hotel expenses) as a result of the late withdrawal or no-show.

For customs and veterinary formalities for horses from abroad, the OC charges approx. 30 EUR per horse.

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Every Athlete is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Reglements 90/426 of the actual valid form (sample is enclosed to schedule) will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The Athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

VETERINARY REGULATIONS, 11th Edition, 1st January 2009

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 23rd Edition, effective 1st January 2009:

Art. 137.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 139.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 139.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 137.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VII

(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

(Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3*/4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge Athletes the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

X. MISCELLANEOUS

1. PROTESTS

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

2. GENERAL CLASSIFICATION AT THE END OF THE COMPETITIONS and PRIZE - CLASSIFICATION

FEI medals to the athletes placed 1st to 3rd in the World Individual Championship (singles/pairs/four-in-hands).

FEI medals to the teams placed 1st to 3rd in the World Team Championship.

3. PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY

All Dressage prize-giving ceremonies will take place on Friday, 14/08/2009 after the end of the last Dressage competition harnessed to the vehicle in the main arena.

All Marathon prize-giving ceremonies will take place on Saturday (evening), 15/08/2009 during the Marathon party in the marquee.

Prize-giving ceremonies obstacle driving and combined rating will take place harnessed to the vehicle on Sunday, 16/08/2009 after each obstacle driving competition of the respective class.

The prize-giving ceremony of the World Team Championship will take place harnessed to the vehicle on Sunday, 16/08/2009 after the end of the last obstacle driving competition/combined competition.

All placed athletes are asked to attend the respective prize-giving ceremony.

4. DISTRIBUTION OF PRIZES AND INDEMNITIES

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 127/128 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts.

Settlement will be done per Athlete. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each Athlete binds himself to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the Athlete. Acc. to § 50a EstG this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the turnover tax from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money, as a rule the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 15 % exceeding 250 EUR (in force as of 01.01.2009); plus solidarity fee (at present 5.5 %) of the income tax amount. Travelling expenses being taken over or reimbursed are only regarded as revenues if they exceed the actual costs and the reimbursement for additional meal allowances acc. to § 4 Abs. 5 Satz 1 Nr. 5 EstG. The tax deduction has to be certified on demand. Those foreign Athletes being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every Athlete himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

5. INSURANCES

All owners and Athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

6. LIABILITY

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, Athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. The OC is liable in case of intent, gross negligence as well as in case of injury to life, body or health and in further cases he is liable for compelling legal liability acc. to the legal requirements. Furthermore he also declines any liability for theft, damages, fire or other incidents.

7. EVENT'S ORGANISATION

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of NF GER, Chefs d'Equipe and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all Athletes and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Driving Department by the Foreign Judge.

8. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS

When doing the accreditation, per athlete admission cards will be handed out to athletes, grooms and horse owners, the names have to be indicated when handing in the entries. Also the national Chefs d'Equipe and trainers will receive admission cards.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
